morning The Souris Light left here at noon for King's Cove to land
sundries sent from this trade. She will undergo repairs at Goose
Bay this winter.

Fine day. Had a quantity of shore fish spread today.
Laborers refused to work this afternoon for usual money sixty
cents.
They required 80 c and as we had a quantity of fish spread had to
comply with their wish for this afternoon - landed sails from E.J.
Ryan
Alfred Hiscock absent today sore back
Flora Sperry's crew left for their respective homes today.

Thursday, November 29
Alfred Hiscock absent from work today.

Friday, November 30
Wind N.N. East a storm with snow falling during day
Mr D.A. Ryan here from St. John's this afternoon pr Ethie
Alfred Hiscock absent today.

Saturday, December 1
Wind W.N. West a light breeze. Dull day. The ground is entirely covered with snow and ? are taking advantage of it as horses & sleigh's are here from the neighbouring places and the driving is excellent. Mr. D.A. Ryan left for King's Cove 4pm.
Alfred Hiscock absent today, sick.

Sunday, December 2
Schr Minnie Harris here for a load of dry Lab fish for Halifax.
Margaret R & Marconi here from King's Cove - Viola here from the Bay.

Monday, December 3

Blew a gale last night from S.W. wind this forenoon W.S.W. & drift
Landed all ballast from Minnie Harris shipped 215 wtls cullage &
eleven casks cod oil and Margaret R & she is now ready for St.
John's

Viola landed some ballast also on wharf - Fine evening.

Tuesday, December 4

Wind S. East blowing strong with heavy sea.

The S.S. Ethie arrived here from Clarendville at 4am and owing to
the strong wind and heavy sea could not leave. She has been
anchored in stream all day. Raining continually this afternoon and
the snow has all disappeared - The JS Morris arrived from St.
John's at 9am having left at 2 making the run in seven hours. The
Minnie Harris took Longers & dunnage today and is now ready to
take in cargo - Gale wind and sea today.

Wednesday, December 5

Wind N.N. W. a fine day. Shipped on board of Schooner Minnie
Harris 1050 qtls dry Labrador codfish.

Margaret R left here for St. John's 9:30pm had a very tedious time

Thursday, December 6

Wind N. West rather fine & hard. Shipped in Minnie Harris today
1020 qtls dry Labrador codfish. We now have on board
altogether 2070 qtls.

Had sails of Imogene spread today and running gear of E.J.
Ryan was also spread out and dried.

Friday, December 7

Wind S.S. West blew very strong all day with continual rain.

Mr Patk Joy went to his home (Carbonear) this afternoon pr S.S.
Ethie

Some Schooners from St. John's anchored here today.

Saturday, December 8

Wind S.S. West in the forenoon with continued rain showers.

About 2:30 wind West and cleared off fine & hard. No day for
handling fish.

Sunday, December 9

Wind W.N.W. blowing very hard - Bitterly cold.

Monday, December 10

Wind N.N. West a strong breeze.

Fine day but very cold.

Shipped on Schr Minnie Harris 430 qtls

Codfish being the balance of her cargo. She now has on board 2500 qtls and is awaiting a time to sail. Had about 30 qtls lge fish spread this afternoon. The Viola left for home in the forenoon but returned about 2:30 owing to wind being too heavy.

Tuesday, December 11

Wind light from E.S.E. Minnie Harris sailed 10am for Halifax and returned at 11am. In afternoon the Harris again sailed, wind then being N.E. with falling snow.

Remoored Cachalot and Marconi this forenoon

Wednesday, December 12

Wind East N East a light breeze.

Captain Connolly and a crew of four men arrived by the Ethie this afternoon to join the Flora W Sperry. They went on board immediately after arrival. She will haul to the Long Wharf in the morning and make ready to take fish cargo.

The Mary Parker arrived here at 3:30 from St. John's She has a general cargo on board for the firm of Messrs Jas Ryan & Coy King's Cove where she proceeds the first favorable wind.

Thursday, December 13

Wind East SE light breeze. Mary Parker left for King's 7:30 this morning. The F.W. Sperry was unmoored and got to Long Wharf today. She will discharge all her ballast as he made ready to take fish cargo for abroad. Mr D.A. Ryan here from King's Cove this afternoon

The crew of the Flora W Sperry signed articles at the Custom House today.

Friday, December 14

Wind N.N. West a strong breeze Fine day for handling fish. Landed all ballast from Flora W Sperry and she is now lingered and dunnage in fold Will begin loading with cod in the morning. Mr. D.A. Ryan returned to King's Cove this forenoon.

Saturday, December 15

Wind N.West shipped in Flora W Sperry today 404 qtls dry shore small codfish.

The Schr Columbia, Russell Master arrived here 12:30 from BVista with a full load lge codfish. She was leaking badly and men were constantly pumping. We landed marble qtls which was stowed in store. There is still a small quantity in cabin about 20 qtls was very wet. Mr E.J. Ryan took passge to St. John's today in Portia.

Sunday, December 16

Monday, December 17

Alf Hiscock & Levi Locke went onboard E.j. Ryan this afternoon taking hot pickle and freed the pump successfully.

The crew of the Columbia goes home tonight in Ethie.

Wind S.W. a light breeze and fine for shipping till 3:30 when it got very dull & snowed a little

Shipped on Flora W. Sperry today 108 qtls small shore dry codfish and 3% large & mdm belonging to Bvista lot

The Columbia was stripped of her sails & running gear today and was moored for the winter. Alf Hiscock superintendant this mooring of the Schooner Columbia Everything was landed from her and stored in a separate place writer advises Robert Stevens to take a couple of hours rest this afternoon.

Tuesday, December 18

Wind NN West a light breeze and fine. Shipped on Flora W.

Sperry today six hundred and fifty eight wtls of codfish large & mdm

Spread about 30 qtls of damp & wet which came out of Bonavista but sent home by Schr Columbia but it did not dry anything scarcely

Wednesday, December 19

Wind NW fine beautiful day. Have the Bonavista large & med samp spread today Parker arrived to us last night 10pm. She has a full load of codfish on board all of which will be transhipped to Sperry for market

Shipped on Sperry today

88 qtls L & mdm from Trinity trade

180 " small dry shore mble from King's Cove trade

Thursday, December 20

Wind West a strong breeze, fine beautiful day. Shipped on Flora W Sperry 290 qtls small mble dry fish and 200 large & mdm both lots were transhipped from Schr Mary parker to Sperry. The Sperry now has 2298 quintals onboard and only a small space is left aft which is when filled will complete her cargo. The S.S> Portia arrived at midnight. Mr. E.J. Ryan came on her. The Mary Parker was stripped of her running gear today and all landed.

Friday, December 21

Wind N.W. a light breeze. Landed and stored from Mary Parker 138.2.14 small mble dry fish and 144.2.71 & mdm - this completed the balance of the cargo bought here from King's Cove. She was moored this evening. John Thorne superintended the mooring of her. The Capt & crew left 6:30 for their homes at King's Cove. The Vernie Mary arrives this pm from St. John's. She bought sundries for this firm Mr. E.J. Ryan went to King's Cove this evening & signed for the Flora Sperry which vessel he joined on arrival here.

Saturday, December 22

Wind rather soft and fine. Landed from Flora W Sperry 350 qtls small dry shore codfish to make room for med or about same quantity large.

Sunday, December 23

Monday, December 24

Wind South dull with misty rain.

Have an order for 100 casks codfish and commenced screwing this forenoon - screwed 54 casks today.

Ethie due tonight 9 pm.

Tuesday, December 25

Dull with occasional rain showers

Wednesday, December 26

Dull with occasional rain showers

Thursday, December 27

Wind South West very dull foggy.

Screwed forty six casks of codfish this forenoon and now have one hundred casks screwed and ready for market. We shall ship these one hundred on Ethie tomorrow. This will be last shipment pr Ethie for the season.

Friday, December 28

Wind West dull. Shipped on Sperry today.

175.2.7 L & mdm codfish viz 13 qtls pm from store ex Mary Parker and ? from store ex Columbia. The Schr Fortune arrived here today with a full load of codfish which will be transhipped to Sperry tomorrow if fine some of Fortune's crew went home by Ethie tonight.

Shipped on Ethie tonight 100 casks codfish (4 qtls) No 1 to 100 marked H&W Carthagenia. This fish belongs to Jas Ryan & Coy's trade and was packed in our store here.

Saturday, December 29

Wind S.West shipped on Flora W Sperry ex Fortune 348.1.21 Lge Mdm codfish amd on Sperry ex store 65 qtls small shore both quantities belong to BVista trade. This completed the Sperry's load. She has now on board 2537 qtls. the Captain cleared from Customes this afternoon and she is now in the stream awaiting a favorable time to sail. The Schr Virginia arrives in Port from King's Cove at 9 pm. She took part cargo of codfish at King's Cove and will finish up here and sail as soon as possible for a foreign market.

Sunday, December 30

The Schr Eitik arrived in port from King's Cove at 8am.

She has a great quantity of codfish onboard taken at Greenspond & King's Cove will complete her cargo here. She will likely finish up tomorrow & sail.

Monday, December 31

Fine beautiful day. Wind N. East sharp breeze at times. Shipped in Eitik from ? 290 -1- 14 small codfish which completed her charter. She sails first - favorable time. F.W. Sperry sailed 4:30pm for Oporto for orders.

Hauled Virginia to wharf today and landed 10 codtraps 1 o/s books, anchors and she is now ready to take codfish.

Mr P. Crockers time expires today. He was paid off tonight Schrs Fortune was moored today Alf Hiscock superintended the mooring of her.
