Wednesday, October 18

Wind Southerly -Fine, dull. No "drieth" today.

"Hunter" came up from Champney's today as no more fish to be sooft there. Too dull for going to Trouty.

Louis G. To Trouty this pm. to see people there.

S.S. "Home" here 12:30pm with our new Magistrate Wm. Short with his family and Household effects.

Culling No 2 fish ex "Lady" in store.

Thursday, October 19

Rained hard last night after 10:30pm. Wind Northerly about 5am, blew strong about 8pm.

Wharves & flake too wet to spread any fish till 10:30am. Spread fish on both wharves & flake today. Wind dropped off at 11pm.

Calm all afternoon & evening.

"Hunter" took 45 qtls at Trouty today and goes to Bonaventure from there.

Friday, October 20

Calm, fine morning.

"Blake" outside Fort 7:30am - sent motorboat out to tow her in.

Began landing & packing her fish at 10am. Packed 128 -15 qtl casks & stored 46 damp.

Jas Meaney's crew in No 3 packed 15 casks cullage.

Saturday, October 21

Fairly good dat. Landed & packed 158 - 5 qtl casks Lab ex

"Blake" and stored 50 qlts damp & large & cabbage.

Packing cullage in casks for St. John's also Prime & seconds for Naples.

Sunday, October 22

Dull in morning - fine evening.

Monday, October 23

Dullish day.

Landed & packed 75 - 5s Lab ex "Blake" till 11am when fish (Indian Tickle & Webbers Cove fish) came out so damp & wet, we started to store it.

In evening packed 29-2 s and 24 - 3 qlts brls ex "Blake". Stored in bulk 282 qlts. Total landing for the day 787 qlts.

#The "Wilson" arrived at Griquet today on way here from Batteau. Packing cullage in casks for St. John's also Prime & seconds for Naples.

Tuesday, October 24

Wind Northerly, light. Landing off deck of "Blake" 15 casks cod oil from Batteau.

Started to land & pack but after a while found fish too wet to pack, so began storing it. Finished discharge "Blake" 6pm.

A fine day after 10pm.

Spread long wharf & flake with damp Labrador & packed it in 3 qt casks in pm.

Had flake filled with damp shore & took it in before dinner. Stored about 880 qlts damp fish from "Blake" all together.

Wednesday, October 25

Wind Southerly - Dull and misty. Fog horn going from 1:30pm.
Packing No 2 shore for Italy and cullage for St. John's in store.
Shipped 40/2s and 40/3s Labrador for Liverpool on "Blake" for St.
John's this pm. Also shipped 2 brls Turbot for Liverpool.
"Hunter" here 7pm yesterday from Bay with 100 qlts fish and a few
odd lots of 1/2 & 3/4 board.

Thursday, October 26

Raining from morning till noon. Wind Southerly. At 12:30pm wind
blew from North.
Men packing seconds for Italy and Cullage for St. John's in store
and some nailing casks.
Lot fine with sunshine 3:36pm. Too late and wharves & flake too
wet to spread any fish this pm.
"Blake" sailed for St. John's 10pm ?? wind.

Friday, October 27

Wind Northerly - Moderate fine.

Loading "Lady" first thing this am with 40 casks cullage - 40 casks cod oil & steel drums. She sailed for St. John's at noon.

Wind then light & inclined go Easterly.

Spread fish on wharves & flake about 10:30 ? as ? first dried off them.

Filled wharf & flake twice today and packed it 3 qlt Brls soon as it had a couple hours (or less) of sun on it.

Discharging "Hunter's" fish collection this pm.

Saturday, October 28

Wind light Southerly.

Very calm all night and presumably "Our Lady" did not get far.

Hour frost again last night even if none, not fine enough to dry to spread any Lab fish.

Damp & dull all day.

"Kyle" S.S. here from Labrador 5pm.

Sunday, October 29

Dull - Southerly - Misty

Monday, October 30

Wind South. Fog & mist all thru day. Fog horn going all day.
"Wilson" arrived at Pacquet Sat. Night past. She left Batteau on
19th and reported as having arrived at Griquet on 23rd Oct.

Tuesday, October 31

Wind Easterly - Dull & foggy - as all thru week past. Fog Horn
going all night and this am up to time of writing.
Fog all thru day. Heavy rain shower at 3pm
Barometer falling this afternoon - it may indicate a change.

Wednesday, November 1

Wind Northerly - Fresh - Dull dry.

S.S. "Jane" here from Bonavista 6:30pm. Too wet & slushy sbow to ship any fish in casks in her tonight.

Showery in pm.

S.S. "Prospero" here going North 5:30pm.

Thursday, November 2

Wind northerly - Fresh.

Started shipping cash fish on S.S. "Jane" ? Shipped 100 casks shore for Naples and 350 casks Labrador for Valencia. Finished 2:30pm and she sailed for St. John's 2:45pm.

"Madeline Hebbs" here from bateau via Ports at 2pm with 615 qlts Lab fish and 2 casks cod oil. Landed 8- qlts from her in store.

Too wet to pack without a dry sun over it.

Friday, November 3

Wind North by East Strong dull - Raw day.

Landing fish ex "Madeline Hebb" from Labrador. All too wet to do any packing. Every fish of her 615 qlts will need a lot of drying - a poor lot of fish, wet a great deal, slack salted and some badly split. "Hebb" collected this fish from Ed Fitzgerald Indian Tickle 407 1/4 qlts and from Joe Coveyduck 208 1/2 total 615 3/4 qlts - Fitzgeralds fish in the whole was better than Coveyducks.

#S.S. "Kyle" here 4:30pm bound Labrador.

Had some fish spread for a few hours, but it dried nothing.

Saturday, November 4

Wind N.E. by North - stiffish.

Wet, rainy day - nothing to be done outside.

Jas Meaney picking & arranging some shore fish in store with fire on.

#"Wilson" arrived at Seldom yesterday and "Saffron" at Conche yesterday, so both Masters wired this pm.

Sunday, November 5

Wind S.E. in am. Veered to S.S.W. - blew strong - dull day. More Westerly in evening with a light scad of hail.

Monday, November 6

Wind West N.W. Strong - fine.

Made two spreadings of Lab fish today on long & short wharfs and flake - also had some spread on alders in front of shop.

Packed 20-5 qlts casks Lab today.

Public Telegraph News reports "Kyle" and "Prospero" storm bound at Twillingate today - "Saffron" & "Wilson" are probably held in harbors also.

We packed 20/5s Lab today & stored 100 qlts dried on wharves - packed 16 casks from above 100qlts.

Tuesday, November 7

Wind Nor West light - fine.

Filled both wharves, flake & ground in front of shop & Dwelling House with damp Labrador. Wind from South 10am Not a good drying day. We packed 165 Lab from 100 qlts stored today also packed 24/5 from wharves & flake today & stored about 80 qlts.

"Our Lady" here from St. John's 8pm.

Wednesday, November 8

North East - Dull rain showers during day.

Packing Lab fish in 5 and 3 qlt casks wet and dry.

"Lady" lying by wharf, all crew at Lab fish.

Thursday, November 9

Wind N.E. light - Dull & showery.

Packing lab fish in 3 qlt Barrels.

Lab fish in casks now pakced in store

186 x3 qlt casks Dry

57x3-----Damp

81-5s Alt casks Dry

72-5-----Damp

Discharged "Our Lady" this pm.

Friday, November 10

Dull morning - Wind S.E.

"Hunter" landing lumber from the Bay after which she was moored up in Cove and sails hoisted for drying.

Sun shine from 9 to 1pm after which it became dull and in evening foggy and misty.

"Hunter's" crew clear of service this pm.

Men variously employed.

Saturday, November 11

Wind S.W. Blowing strong. Dull early after last nights rain. Got finer as day advanced. Spread some shore fish on flake at 10:30am.

"Howard Young" got to coal wharf & started to discharge at 1pm.

This pm blowing a gale from Westward.

Hubert Peddle & Sullivan Wm. gone out in motor boat to pilot S.S.

"Lou" in from Port Union 6pm to take our Lab fish. "Lou" S.S. left Port Union 1:30pm got here 6:30pm.

Sunday, November 12

Fine day Wind West - moderate. Raining hard & strong Southerly wind 9:30pm.

Monday, November 13

Wind N. by West Fresh - Fine.

Started shipping fish on S.S. "Lou" at 7am and finished at noon.

153 - 5s Labrador

16-5s do L&M

243-3s do "

412 Pkges "Lou" started for Bay Roberts 1:30pm.

"Howard Young" discharging coal in coal shed.

"Our Lady" landed 2?? coal in flour store.

Had some shore fish spread on flake and some stacks ? Lab
and long wharf.

Tuesday, November 14

Stiffish breeze - dull - wind Southerly

Sch "Wilson" here from Batteau 11am. This vessel left Batteau on
19th Oct. & harbored at Griquet, Pachtet, Seldom & Valleyfield -
quite a long passage.

Schr. Got to wharf & landed cid oil & steel drums off deck, too dull
to land any fish.

Wednesday, November 15

Blew a hurricane from S by West with rain around 6am today.

Blowing strong all day with the occasional scud of rain.

#"Wilson" started discharge 1pm landed & packed 26/5 and stored 16 qlts small & damp.

#"Saffron" wires from "Seldom" was out today - carried away ? main boom tore up mainsail ? spare mainsail and ready at 11:30am today to sail when wind permits.

Thursday, November 16

Wind Southerly - Rain falling 6am. Snow falling 9:30am

"Wilson" crew employed in store nailing casks in forenoon. ?

packing small ? cod , cullage in casks.

Not fine enough any time today to land fish from "Wilson".

Friday, November 17

Wind Northerly - Fresh- fine.

"Wilson" discharging fish - packing in 5 qtl casks as tis landed.

This is a choice drying day.

Had flake filled with damp shore fish and dried all wet ex

"Wilson" on wharf as it was thrown out. Finished discharge of all dry fish aboard "Wilson" this pm turned out 655 1/4 qlts total.

We have her salt bulk fish to be landed and stored tomorrow.

Saturday, November 18

Wind N.N.W. light moderate fine.

"Saffron" arrived around 1am from Labrador. Had a hard passage en route - carried away main boom (??) six feet ?? and had mainsail tore up

"Wilson" landed salt bulk fish today & swine was salted & put in No 2 store.

"Saffron" landed cod oil, cod traps etc. And hot moored in pound after "Wilson" finished discharging at 4pm. Had some fish spread on flake but it dried little or nothing. Snowed some tonight & later turned to rain.

Sunday, November 19

Fine day. Ground partly covered with snow Wind northerly raw.

Monday, November 20

Wind Northerly - Fresh fine - wind dropping off afternoon - calm
afternoon & evening

"Saffron" began discharge this am. Landed & packed 182 -3S &
15 -5s and stored 76 qlts damp & cullage.

It was not a food drying day.

Tuesday, November 21

Wind N.E. strong with drifting snow which started during the night.

At noon wind seems to be going more to the North.

Wednesday, November 22

Wind Southerly - Moderate. Fine but not drying any.

"Saffron" discharging, but some of fish not coming so good as was landed on Monday.

Raining 6pm and continued more or less all thru night.

Thursday, November 23

Wind N.E. light dull

"Saffron" started land some fish at 7pm as it got fine enough for landing but no drieth in the air.

Settling up with Wilsons & Saffrons crews today.

Wire from Hon. D.A. at 7:30pm saying to pack all Lab bulks in store tonight that S.S. "Pollux" would be leaving St. John's at midnight for here for our casks of Labrador fish and not to delay her etc.

Friday, November 24

Wind N.E. Snowing at 5am & before that.

Soon as light enough, started packing damp Labrador fish in store. At 9am still snowing, started land fish from Saffron - hoisted a foresail, cuff up between fore & main masts of Saffron, which kept snow from falling in hold & sheltered cullers & fish barrows on wharf. Culled fish on wharf & weighed and packed in store - finished discharge (about 350 qtls) Saffron about 3pm.

S.S. "Pollux" here 9am from St. John's. Started shipping in "Pollux" 3pm and had 170 - 5 qtls casks aboard at 6pm when we ceased work.

"Wilson" and "Saffron's" crews all paid off & ready to go home in the "Wilson" - "Wilson" sailed 9:30pm but returned an hour later.

Saturday, November 25

Wind Southerly and with drizzly rain of am.

At 6am "pollux" started to heave up to come nearer our wharf. ? were fouled and their windows got smashed up.

At 9am fine & hard - almost calm. Finished shipping all our Lab cask fish at noon. Shipped 553 pkges equal to 2173 qtls.

Rained hard 4pm then got finer. "Saffron" by wharf with clear hold - put secure ballast aboard her this pm.

Sunday, November 26

Wind Nor Nor West. Stiff - fine - Fine and frosty.

Several crafts left here for St. John's from 8 to 10am.

"Wilson" also left for Hodge's Cove.

Monday, November 27

Wind South in fore part of day

Snowing & blowing strong from about 4am till 11am, then turned to rain.

Wind S.W. in evening and warm at 6pm.

A bad day.

Tuesday, November 28

Wind Northerly - Fresh breeze. Fine and cold.

"Saffron" loaded with 118 casks fish, 68 casks cod oil - 96 qlts cull fish, 24 ? Brazil drums & 20 steel drums and hauled off from to the stream at 5:30pm. A good day work.

Capt Hubert Peddle left office with his instructions 9:30pm ? he intended sailing at once - a fine Northerly breeze then.

"Saffron" away from anchorage 10:30pm about St. John's - a fine stiff breeze then.

Wednesday, November 29

Wind N.N.W. Fine and frosty. A stiffish breeze.

"Saffron" arrived St. John's at 7am today so Skipper Hubert
Peddle wires.

A hard fine day.

S.S. "Kyle" here 9pm from Labrador

#J. Sheehan, Tom Sullivan, Jus T. Gushue & house girl came by
here.

Tuesday, December 26

Wind Nor West very high and frosty.

Writer returned from King's Cove this pm in motorcar to Eastside.

Wednesday, December 27

Gale Southerly wind all day with very heavy rain. Not so much rain in afternoon as in forenoon.

Thursday, December 28

Very cold last night. Hard breeze from N.N.West today and air very keen and bracing.

Friday, December 29
