Sunday, October 16

Wind North, light. Fine and very warm.

Monday, October 17

Wind South light.

"Wilson" here at 1pm taking crew of "Saffron" to their homes.

Raining after dinner and continued all through evening.

Tuesday, October 18

Between midnight (last night) and two am it blew a gale from the North East, after that it started to moderate a little but it blew a good breeze all day with scattered showers in forenoon.

Clearing a bit in evening and getting cold.

Wednesday, October 19

Wind Southerly. Dull. Raining in afternoon.

S.S. "Kyle" left St. John's at 10am for Labrador.

"Wilson" at Hickmans Harbor this pm weeking to buy a few thousand staves.

Thursday, October 20

Wind North - dull.

S.S. "Kyle" here at 4:30am bound to Labrador on her final trip.

"Hunter" arrived at Pacquet this pm all well. "Hunter" is coming from Labrador with a load of dry codfish having left Batteau on Sunday 9th inst.

Friday, October 21

Wind Southerly with thick fog in forenoon and very heavy rain after dinner. At 6pm blowing strong.

"Wilson" arrived from Bay at 3pm.

Saturday, October 22

Wind North, light, fine.

"Wilson" left for St. John's at 6pm laden with 187 Brls Labrador codfish, 32 casks cod oil and 15 steel drums.

Sunday, October 23

Fine day. Wind North, good breeze in forenoon.

"Wilson" arrived at St. John's at 4am.

Monday, October 24

Fine day. Wind South West blowing strong.

"Hunter" arrived at Seldom come by last night all well.

Tuesday, October 25

Wind South blowing a gale all day with heavy rain after dinner.

Wednesday, October 26

Fine day. Wind West shifting to South West, light.

Schooner "Bertha E. Way" here from Batteau at 3pm with a full cargo (3000 Qtls) Labrador codfish.

S.S "Sagona" here from St. John's at 5pm.

Thursday, October 27

Wind South West, fine.

"Bertha E. Way" discharging and landed 566 Qtls today.

Friday, October 28

Fine day. Wind South West shifting to North East after dinner. Schooner "Hunter" arrived from Labrador early this morning with a load of dry codfish. This vessel left bateau on Sunday the 9th, inst.

Landed 760 Qtls from "Bertha E. Way" today.

Saturday, October 29

Sull and soft wind South East, very light - scarcely any at times. Landed 272 Qtls from "Bertha E. Way" did not commence until 2pm thought too damp to do anything before dinner.

Sunday, October 30

Wind light and variable. Fairly fine.

Monday, October 31
Wind North East, cold.
"Wilson" arrived from St. John's at midnight (Saturday night).

Tuesday, November 1
Wind North East.
Landed 88 Q'ts from "Bertha E. Way" this morning but had to
discontinue landing owing to rain.

Wednesday, November 2

Raining all day. Wind North East, fair breeze.

"Hunter's " crew settled up this pm.

Thursday, November 3

Cold with snow showers, wind North blowing strong all day.

"Hunter" commenced discharging at 2pm.

"Bertha E. Way" landed today 240 Qtls dry and 166 Qtls salt bulk.

Friday, November 4

Fine day. Wind Southwest very light.

S.S. "Sagona" here from North at 10:30am. Mr W.N. White went to St. John's by "Sagona".

"Bertha E. Way" finished discharging at noon.

"Saffron" left for Hodge's Cove at noon with "Hunter's" crew.

Landed 236 Qtls from "Hunter" today.

Snowing from 5pm until sometime after midnight - when it turned to rain.

Saturday, November 5

A very close day. No wind of any account. Rain which fell between midnight and daylight took away what snow fell last night.

"Saffron" returned to port around 6 o'clock last evening and left again this morning.

Sunday, November 6

Calm, soft day.

Monday, November 7

A beautifully fine day - no wind.

"Bertha E. Way" left this morning for home.

"Hunter" finished discharging at 4pm.

Tuesday, November 8

Wind Easterly, soft.

Had some Labrador fish spread.

Unbent sails and gear from Schnrs "Wilson" and "Hunter",
moored former in Tom Jones Cove and will carry up the latter
tomorrow.

S.S. "Kyle" here from Labrador at 4pm. Mr J.T. Sheehan, Thos
Sullivan and housekeeper returned from bateau by "Kyle".

"Saffron" here from Hodges at 9 oclock last night.

Wednesday, November 9

Dull, raining at 5pm. Wind Southerly, blowing strong after dinner.
Mr W.N. White returned from St. John's by "Sagona" at 6:30 last evening.

Thursday, November 10

Fine day. Wind North blowing strong for a time.
Shipped 170 Qtls shore codfish on "Saffron" for St. John's and
packed 50 - 2 Qtl Barrels Labrador fish.

Friday, November 11

Wind East North East blowing strong till 3pm when it began to moderate.

Saturday, November 12

Dull day - Wind Southerly light.

"Saffron" ready for St. John's at 3pm with Labrador and shore codfish, cod oil etc.

Sunday, November 13

Wind North blowing very strong from early morning until 1pm when it started to moderate.

Monday, November 14

"Saffron" left Saint John's at 3 o'clock yesterday evening.

Wind today South South West blowing a gale for a time with heavy rain.

"Saffron" returned to port at 3pm having got within 5 miles of St. John's but had to retreat on account of the heavy wind.

Tuesday, November 15

Fine day. Wind West, blowing strong.

Had some Labrador fish spread, it dried fairly well.

"Saffron" repairing mainsail and jumbo boom.

Wednesday, November 16

Fine day. Wind North West.

"Saffron" finished repairing mainsail and will sail for St. John's tonight, should wind be favorable.

Had flake and wharves filled with Labrador fish today. This fish is being dried for the Porto Rico market.

"Sagona" here at 7am bound to St. John's.

Thursday, November 17

Wind West North West, light, fine.

"Saffron" sailed at 7am for St. John's

Had all available space filled with Labrador fish for drying.

"Saffron" arrived at St. John's at 4:30pm - all well.

Friday, November 18

Wind Southerly, fresh breeze with rain before dinner. Wind dropped in evening and at 5pm it was calm and foggy.

Saturday, November 19

Wind Southerly, good breeze with rain best part of day.

The yacht "Marvel" belonging to The Grenfell Association and captioned by Percy Barbour arrived here this forenoon from Labrador.

Sunday, November 20

Wind East North East. Cold and raw. Raining all day.

Monday, November 21

Wind North West light, fairly fine.

Wharves and flake not dry enough to spread Labrador codfish.

Tuesday, November 22

Fine. Wind North West, light. A very light scud of snow fell last night.

Wednesday, November 23
Wind Southerly. Light, dull.

Thursday, November 24
Wind North East, light.
Fine in forenoon, had few Q'ts Labrador fish but there was no
drieth.
Snowing at 4pm.

Friday, November 25

Raining all day. Wind North East light. About one foot of snow fell last night and after midnight.

Saturday, November 26

Raining from sometime after midnight till early this morning which took away practically all the snow that fell yesterday morning.

Wind today North West, fairly fine.

Sunday, November 27

Wind North light until 4pm when it veered South and then South East.

Monday, November 28

Four 8 oclock last night until about 4 oclock this morning it blew a gale from the South East with heavy thick snow.

Sometime between the hours of 9 and 11 oclock last night the Schooner "Marion Rodgers" owned by Wm Jas Butler of Bonaventure and in charge of Wm Hogarth of Trinity East coming from St. John's struck just outside the lighthouse on Fort Point and became a total wreck with the loss of her crew of seven men.

Parts of the wreck and come of her cargo were found this morning strewn along the shore between John McGrath's place and the Nuddick.

Wind this morning blowing a hurricane from the South West until about noon when it veered West and became colder.

Shipped 100 - 2 Qtl Brls Labrador codfish on Schnr "Artur W" this pm.

Tuesday, November 29

Wind North West blowing a gale with snow flurries from early morning until after dinner when wind dropped.

Too stormy today for boats to do any searching outside where "Marion Rodgers" went ashore - it is hoped that the bodies may be got.

Wednesday, November 30

Wind Southerly, fair breeze with rain before dinner. Some snow fell last night or early this morning but the rain of today took it all away.

Schnr "Arthur W" in port waiting a favorable time for Saint John's.

Schooner "Saffron" ready at St. John's for here.

Quite a number of boats are out around Fort Point today, but there was too much sea to get very near the rocks.

Thursday, December 1

Winds shifting. Very little in morning.

Schooner "Arthur W" left early for St. John's.

The men who were at Fort Point this am succeeded in jiggging up four bodies. The bodies recovered were those of Capt. Hogarth and his son Leslie and Wm J. Butler and his brother Ellis.

Wind at noon was Southerly and increased as evening advanced with thick snow.

S.S. "Sagona" in port from St. John's at 5:30pm.

Friday, December 2

Wind North East blowing strong snowing fast until noon when wind shifted to North when it cleared and became colder.

Saturday, December 3

Fine day. Wind North West, nice breeze.

Had Labrador fish spread today.

Schooner "Arthur W" arrived at St. John's at noon today.

The funeral of Wm Hogarth and his son took place this afternoon at Trinity East and was very largely attended.

The body of Wm Jas Butler was taken to Bonaventure today for burial.

Sunday, December 4

Dull wind South West, fair breeze.

"Saffron" arrived from Saint John's at 5pm. ##

Monday, December 5

Dull Wind Northerly light.

"Saffron" hauled to wharf and finished discharging today.

The body of Simon Pitcher was jiggered up in the Narrows last evening, brought to Court House and prepared for burial and was taken to Bonaventure this am.

Tuesday, December 6

Wind Southerly, raining practically all day.

The body of Edward McGrath was found today and brought ashore. He was a passenger in the Schooner "Marion Rodgers" which was lost with all hands, near the lighthouse here, on Sunday night 27th.

Mr & Mrs E.J. Ryan went to St. John's by this evening's train.

Crew of Schnr "Saffron" clear of service this pm.

Wednesday, December 7

Wind South West blowing a gale all day.

The funeral of Edward McGrath took place this afternoon.

John Ryan who lived with Wm Thoulman at Trinity East died last night.

It was too rough today for men and boats to do any searching for the body of Alfred Pitcher which is the only one not recovered from the wreck of the Schnr "Marion Rodgers".

Thursday, December 8

Fine day. Wind North West blowing a gale all day.

Friday, December 9

Dull, very little wind from any direction.

A good many people around today from outside places.

Boats searching today for the body of Alfred Pitcher but did not locate it.

S.S. "Sagona" here from North at 7am.

Saturday, December 10

Wind South East, snowing before dinner which later turned to rain.

Sunday, December 11

Wind North East, light but increasing as day advanced and between 8 and 10pm it was blowing a gale.

Monday, December 12

Fine day. Wind North West, light.

Moored "Saffron" in Tibbs Cove this am.

Mr E.G. Grant passed away at 1pm after a very short illness. The late Mr Grant was manager for Messrs Job Brothers Co at Blanc Sablon for a number of years where he carried on a very successful fishery business and from which he retired in 19 . He was a member of the House of Assembly for four years having represented this district from 1909 to 1913. He leaves a widow, one son and three daughters.

Tuesday, December 13

Wind North East, blowing strong. Commenced snowing at 9am which increased as day advanced and from noon till 5pm it was snowing fast and drifting a bit.

Wednesday, December 14
Wind West, light fine.

Thursday, December 15
Wind South West raining in forenoon. After dinner wind West clearing.
Schooner "Ema Frampton" arrived from St. John's at 8am.
The funeral of the late Mr E.G. Grant took place at 2 oclock this evening.

Friday, December 16

Wind West blowing very strong from early morning until 1pm when it dropped off.

Saturday, December 17

Fine day. Wind West light.

Carted 50 barrels Labrador codfish to station this pm for shipment to St. John's by Tuesday's train. This fish is intended for Liverpool and will go from St. John's by S.S. "Nova Scotia" on the 27th inst.

Sunday, December 18

Wind Southerly, light.

Monday, December 19

Wind North East. Cold and raw.

Roads covered with a glitter which makes walking very dangerous.

A very large mail came here by last night's train.

Mr E.J. Ryan returned from Saint John's by last night's train.

Tuesday, December 20

Wind North East, cold.

Landing ballast from "Saffron" today before mooring Schooner for the winter.

Wednesday, December 21

Wind East North East, fair breeze. Snowing before daylight and raining after dinner.

Thursday, December 22

A stormy day, wind North East blowing strong with snow. Wind increasing as day advanced and at 5pm it was blowing a gale. Fine day mild, rained during afternoon.

Moored "Saffron" in Tom Jones Cove and hauled up motor boat in dock this am.

Friday, December 23

It was very stormy last

A stormy day - Wind North East, blowing strong with snow. Wind increasing as day advanced and at 6pm it was blowing a gale.

Snowing fast with high drift.

Saturday, December 24

Wind North East, decreasing. It was very stormy last night.

Snowing fast and drifting furiously.

Passengers who went from here by last night's train had to walk to station and found the 'going' very difficult.

A lot of snow in place after blizzard of yesterday and last night.

Sunday, December 25

Wind North East. Fine day.

Monday, December 26

At 6 o'clock last evening it was blowing strong and snowing fast and continued so all during the night. Wind today North East fine. Piles of snow in some places after last night's storm.

All stores closed today.

Aux Schooner "Trinity North", Capt H. Stone Jr here from Port Rexton this pm en route to Thoroughfare.

Tuesday, December 27

Wind North West shifting to North East after dinner.

Mr W.N. White hence to Saint John's by today's train.

Commenced stock taking this am.

Wednesday, December 28

Wind South S. West blowing very strong.

The Engine, tender and a flat car became derailed last evening about 100 yards from station and it was not until 2 o'clock this morning that train could proceed. There were several passengers aboard and there were a few going from here, among whom were Mr & Mrs Walter N. White and Mr S.J. Hefferton.

Thursday, December 29

Fine. Cold, wind North West, light.

Friday, December 30

Wind South West, fine. Cold. Wind increasing after dinner and at 6pm it was blowing strong.

Saturday, December 31

Fine. Wind North West. Cold.
