Started packing Labrador fish this pm for the Porto Rico market.

M.V. "Isabel H" here at 9am from St. John's.

Monday, January 16
Wind Easterly light, mild.
Packing Labrador fish from Port Rico.

Tuesday, January 17
Fine. Wind Easterly.
Had Labrador fish spread today but there was no drieth.
Mrs Margaret G. Ryan, widow of the late Hon DA Ryan passed
away last evening at St. John's.
Shop closed today.

Wednesday, January 18

Wind North, fresh breeze. Fine in forenoon.

Spread Labrador fish this am, had to take it in again at 1:30pm on account of snow flurries.

Thursday, January 19

S.S. "Sagona" arrived from North at 6:30 last evening and remained in port all night.

Friday, February 3

Fine. Wind West light, cold. Harbor caught over last night.

Saturday, February 4

Fine clear and cold. No wind.

Sunday, February 5

A cold day. Wind North West, fair breeze.

Monday, February 6

Fine, cold. Wind North West. Harbor frozen over, a few people crossed today.

Mr Wm Humphries Govt Codfish Inspector here this am by train from Catalina to the packings of some of our Labrador codfish destined for Puerto Rico.

Tuesday, February 7

A very fine day. Wind West, light.

Had Labrador fish spread today and continued packing with Mr Humphries as Supervisor.

Wednesday, February 8

Dull. Wind North shifting to North East after dinner with snow.

We have 174 Barrels Labrador fish packed now for Porto Rico.

Thursday, February 9

Fine day. Wind North. Cold. Harbor ice is now good and strong.

Friday, February 10

A very cold day. Wind West, strong.

Finished packing Porto Rico fish last evening, total packed for that market 228 Barrels.

Mr Humphries who had been here since the 6th supervising the culling and packing of the above 228 Barrels left for Catalina by this morning's train.

Commenced culling and packing for Liverpool today.

His Holiness Pop Pius XI passed away this am, the deceased was 82 years old and was Pope for 17 years.

Saturday, February 11

Wind South West, blowing strong. Although it is soft and mild, the wind is very cold and raw.

Sunday, February 12

Fine day Wind South West, shifting to North West and becoming colder.

Monday, February 13

Wind South West, blowing strong with several heavy snow squalls accompanied by high drift.

Rev Father Murphy here from King's Cove last evening with horse and sleigh.

Tuesday, February 14

Fine day. Wind North West fair breeze, cold.

The body of the later Baxter Bailey, son of Mr & Mrs Wm Bailey of this place and who was drowned off Cape Cod on the 3rd, inst, when the motor vessel "Lutzen" went ashore, came by today's train.

Wednesday, February 15

Wind S.S. West blowing strong with heavy rain all day.

Thursday, February 16

Raining all day. Wind S.S. West, blowing a gale.

Friday, February 17

Fine day. Cold. Wind West.

The funeral of the Baxter bailey took place this afternoon.

We have 7 horses engaged today hauling Labrador fish in 2 Qtl
Brls to station.

Saturday, February 18

Wind South West. Mild with scattered snow showers in forenoon.

Finished hauling fish to station this am, a total of 328 Brls (2
carloads) of which 228 Brls are for Porto Rico and 100 Brls for
Liverpool - these 2 cars will leave here on Monday morning 20th
on arrival of regular train from Bonavista.

Sunday, February 19

A cold day. Wind West, blowing strong with heavy drift in
forenoon. Very cold in afternoon.

Monday, February 20

Wind North East. Cold and raw. Commenced snowing at 3pm.
Harbor ice broke up yesterday and drifted out.

Tuesday, February 21

Fine day. Wind North West, cold. About five to six inches of snow
fell last evening and night.

Wednesday, February 22

Ash Wednesday - General Holiday.

All stores closed.

Snowing fast in forenoon with wind blowing strong, until 2pm when it cleared off and got mild.

Thursday, February 23

Fine day. Wind South West, mild but getting colder after dinner.

Friday, February 24
Wind South West, light. Cold.

Saturday, February 25
Wind South. Snowing fast from 10am until 3pm when it cleared up
and got mild.

Sunday, February 26
Fine day, cold. Wind North West, good breeze.

Monday, February 27

Wind North East, fair breeze. Snowing from early morning till noon when it turned to rain and continued for a couple of hours after which it cleared off with wind West.

About thirty five sealers left here by this morning's train to join their ships at Saint John's for the seal fishery. Majority of these men will be going with Capt. Stanley Barbour in S.S. "Terra Nova".

Tuesday, February 28

Fine. Cold. North West fair breeze.

S.S. "Ranger" sailed from St. John's at 4:30pm for Channel from whence she will clear for the seal fishery the Gulf.

Wednesday, March 1

Wind South East, snowing fast until 1pm when it ceased and started to rain, which continued for a couple of hours. At 6pm, wind South West blowing strong.

Thursday, March 2

Fine day. Cold. Wind North West.

Friday, March 3

Very cold day. Wind West. Strong breeze. Harbor ice broke up and drifted out yesterday.

Saturday, March 4

Fine day, not so cold as yesterday and preceding day. Wind North West decreasing as day advanced.

Steamers "Ungava", "Neptune" and "Eagle" sailed this am from St. John's this morning followed by S.S. "Terra Nova" at 1pm for the seal fishery.

The S.S. "Ranger" which left St. John's on Tuesday, 28th, ulto, became disabled off St. Lawrence owing to seas flooding engine room was towed into Trespassy last night by S.S. "Imogene".

Sunday, March 5

Wind North shifting to South West after dinner with snow flurries.

Monday, March 6

Wind South, mild, shifting to North East after dinner. Snowing all day.

S.S. "Ranger" in tow of "Imogene" arrived at St. John's from Trepassy Saturday night. The latter will sail for the seal fishery this evening or tomorrow. At time of writing this it is not known whether "Ranger" will go 'out' or not.

Fine, mild. Wind South west light. Colder in afternoon.

Wednesday, March 8

Cold day. Wind West, blowing strong.

S.S. "Terra Nova" reported last night as being 25 miles North West of Cape Ray.

Thursday, March 9

Fine day, clear and cold. Wind North West, blowing strong.

Friday, March 10

Cold. Wind North West.

Packing Labrador codfish for Liverpool today.

It was very cold last night.

Yesterday's report from the sealing steamers gave their position as 80 miles North East of the Funks, weather stormy and ice heavy.

Saturday, March 11

Fine day. Wind North West, light. It was very cold last night. Glass registering 8 below zero.

A few people crossed over the Harbor ice this pm.

Sunday, March 12

Very cold day. Wind North West, blowing strong.

Monday, March 13

Fine day. Wind North West, decreasing with a little higher temperature, but still cold.

Horses employed today hauling some Labrador codfish to station for St. John's thence by steamer to Liverpool.

Tuesday, March 14

Stormy, snowing and drifting all day. Wind North East, blowing strong.

Wednesday, March 15

Mild. Wind North East, fair breeze. West snow falling all day.
Sealing news last night was to the effect that S.S. "Beothic" had struck a patch of seals and secured 500 and S.S. "Terra Nova" in Gulf had sighted some seals.

Thursday, March 16

Fine. Wind North East, cold.

Friday, March 17

St. Patrick's Day. Stores and office of this firm closed.

A beautifully fine day, wind North West light.

Saturday, March 18

Fine not cold, very little wind from any direction.

Had some Labrador codfish spread today.

Started packing 25 Brls Labrador fish at 3pm and at 6pm had the last load on way to station.

Sunday, March 19

(No Entry)

Monday, March 20

A very fine day. Wind North West, blowing fairly strong in morning, but decreasing as day advanced and at 6pm it was almost calm. Had Labrador fish spread today.

Mrs K.M.G. Ryan accompanied by her son Mr Herbert F. Who is residing in England were on this morning's train en route to St. John's. The latter came from England to see his uncle Mr J.S. McCarthy of Bonavista who is very ill. Mr Ryan will return to England by S.S. "Nova Scotia" sailing from St. John's on or about the 24th inst.

Thursday, March 23

Had some Labrador fish spread today.

Friday, March 24

The six sealing steamers on the front have so far secured only 60000 seals. The S.S. "Terra Nova" which is operating in the Gulf has done nothing.

Sealing steamers on the front have done nothing the past week and S.S. "Terra Nova" is jammed with no seals to date.

Thursday, March 30

Fine day. Cold. Wind West South West shifting to South after dinner.

Motor boat here this am from Ireland's Eye.

Last night's sealing news showed no change.

Friday, March 31

Wind South East, with snow and the rain in forenoon. Clearing in evening and becoming colder.

Saturday, April 1

Wind North East, blowing strong. Harbor ice broke up and drifted out last night.

Sunday, April 2

A fine day. Wind North light.

Monday, April 3

Wind South, with thick fog all day.

Tuesday, April 4

Mild. Wind South East shifting to North East after breakfast.

Snowing all day.

Wednesday, April 5
A very fine day, warm. Wind South West.

Thursday, April 6
Wind North East, with snow flurries after dinner.

Friday, April 7
Good Friday. All stores closed.
Fine day. Wind North, fair breeze.

Saturday, April 8
A very nice day, warm. Wind North East in morning shifting to
South after dinner.
Had a good bit of Labrador fish spread today.

Sunday, April 9
Cold, raw day. Wind Easterly.

Monday, April 10

Wind North West, snowing and drifting all day.

Tuesday, April 11

Dull and soft. Wind North West.

Train which left Bonavista yesterday at 1pm arrived at Trinity Junction at 7pm and owing to stormy weather which was then prevailing remained there all night and left for Clarendville early this morning.

Mr. Wm Humphries , Codfish Inspector came here by train last night from Catalina. Mr. Humphries will supervise the culling and packing of 215 Brls Labrador codfish which we are packing for Porto Rico.

Wednesday, April 12

Dull and raw. Wind in morning Southerly, light, shifting to South East with thick snow.

Thursday, April 13

Wind South to South West blowing strong and becoming cold after dinner. A good bit of snow fell yesterday and last night.

Friday, April 14

A beautifully fine day, wind North West.

Had wharves, flake and other spaces spread with Labrador fish today. This fish will be packed for Porto Rico.

Schooner "W.J. Ellison", Capt. D. Stoyles, arrived from St. John's at 1pm and hauled to our wharf after dinner to land a quantity of goods.

Mr Humphries returned to Catalina by this morning's train without packing any fish.

Saturday, April 15

Fine with wind S.S. West until 1pm when it got dull with snow flurries at 5pm.

Had all available space filled with Labrador fish for drying but had to take it in immediately after dinner.

M.V. "Isabel H" here from Catalina at 8am took 100 Brls Labrador fish onboard and left for St. John's at 9:30am.

Mr W.N. White went to St. John's by "Isabel H".

Sunday, April 16

A cold stormy day, wind West blowing a gale with high drift.

Monday, April 17

Wind North East - fair breeze. Fairly fine for a couple of hours after dinner when we had some Labrador fish spread.

The Bonavista Branch Train which passed through at 4 o'clock last evening from Clarendville did not proceed any further than Port Rexton. It has to wait there for the arrival of an engine and plough before it can continue in to Bonavista. After yesterday's blizzard there is too much snow without using a plough.

Tuesday, April 18

Fine day. Wind North shifting to South West.

Had wharves and flake spread full & Labrador fish today.

Mr. Humphries here from Catalina at noon today and started packing and culling at 2pm.

Wednesday, April 19

Dull day. Wind South East with wet snow showers around noon. Mr W.N. White arrived from St. John's by train last night. Mr. White left St. John's at 5 oclock on Monday evening and had to remain at Clarenville all day yesterday.

Thursday, April 20

Wind Easterly light, with dense fog all day. Raining at 5pm. Too dull to pack any Labrador fish today.

Friday, April 21

A fine day. Wind South West, light.

Drying and packing Labrador fish for Porto Rico.

Saturday, April 22

A very fine day, Wind South West.

Spread and dried 150 Qtls or more of Labrador codfish today.

Sunday, April 23

Dull. Wind South East with scattered showers.

Monday, April 24

Wind Southerly, strong breeze, foggy.

M.V. "Isabel H" here at 4:30pm from Catalina for our 338 Brls Labrador fish, which was all on board at 7pm. Vessel went to Government Wharf and will remain there till daylight, when she will leave for St. John's.

Tuesday, April 25

Wind Easterly, light with snow flurries after dinner.

M.V. "Isabel H" arrived at St. John's at 8am.

Wednesday, April 26

Dull day with snow flurries. Wind North East shifting to South East after dinner.

Moto vessel "Trinity North" here from Monroe this pm bound to St. John's.

Thursday, April 27

Fine day. Little or no wind in morning.

Had 150/200 Qts Labrador fish spread today.

Wind Easterly light in afternoon.

Friday, April 28

Not fine enough to spread any fish today.

Wind Southerly veering North East after dinner.

Saturday, April 29

A fine day, wind West. Fair breeze.

Spread and dried a big lot of Labrador fish today.

Sunday, April 30

Wind Easterly. Cold and raw. After tea, wind South East with sleet.

Monday, May 1

Roads and hills covered with snow (to a depth of two to four inches) this morning which fell sometime before daylight. Wind today South West, clearing in afternoon.

Tuesday, May 2

Dull day with Snow flurries in forenoon. Wind variable shifting to North in evening.

Wednesday, May 3
Wind North. Dull.

Thursday, May 4
Fine day. Wind South West.
Labrador fish which we had spread today about 200 Qtls - dried well.
S.S. "Sagona" here from St. John's at 5pm bound North, on here first trip for the season.
Schooner "Arthur W." Capt W.G. Mills here from St. John's via Port Rexton at 8:30pm.

Friday, May 5

Wind South East, fair breeze. Commenced snowing at 6:30am and continued until noon when it cleared up a bit.

M.V. "Isabel H" here from Catalina at 6am took our 75 Brls fish and left for St. John's at 6:30am.

Saturday, May 6

Winter weather prevailing today.

Wind North East blowing strong with thick snow from early morning until noon when it cleared and became cold.

Sunday, May 7

Wind North fair breeze. Cold.

Monday, May 8

Wind North East, cold.

M.V. "Trinity North" arrived from St. John's last evening with freight for sundry parties and a new automobile for Mr Rubert Morris.

S.S. "Sagona" which left here on Thursday 4th is detained at Greenspond owing to ice.

Brought Schooner "H.F. Wilson" down from Tom Jones Cove this pm. Had men employed practically all last week sawing ice, which was eighteen inches thick before Schooner could be got out.

Tuesday, May 9

Fine day. Wind South West.

Kenneth Fowlow brought his Schooner from her winter moorings and tied up at Government wharf for cleaning up and painting etc.

Wednesday, May 10

Dull, wind South. Harbor filling with drift ice. Foggy after tea.

Thursday, May 11

Dull and calm. Loose ice drifting around Harbor.

Motor Vessels "Isabel H" and "Mazeltov" which harbored here yesterday en route to Catalina left here this morning to try to get around ice. The latter returned having found ice too heavy.

Friday, May 12
Fine day. Wind South West. Nice and warm.

Saturday, May 13
Raining all day. Wind North East, fair breeze.

Sunday, May 14
Wind North East, cold.

Monday, May 15

Fine day. Wind South South West. Harbor filling with ice.
#James Meaney at work this am.

Tuesday, May 16

Wind South East. Raining after dinner. Harbor filled with heavy ice.

Wednesday, May 17

Wind South West. Fine.

Impossible to heave Schooners out owing to Harbor being filled with ice.

Thursday, May 18

Wind Southerly with heavy rain in forenoon. After dinner wind shifted to South West blowing strong.

Mr Chidley, Government Fish Inspector, here by this morning's train from Port Union. Mr. Chidley will weigh our stock of Labrador codfish which we have in store.

Friday, May 19
Fine day. Wind West North West, blowing.

Saturday, May 20
Wind Southerly shifting to West after dinner.
Finished weighing our Labrador codfish this pm. Total quantity
now on hand is 1765 Qts.
Mr Chidley returned to Port Union by this evening's train.

Sunday, May 21
Wind North, blowing strong. Ground was covered with snow early
this morning - it melted quickly when the sun came up.

Monday, May 22

Wind South West. Strong breeze. Fine.

Hove out Schooner "Wilson" and copper painted on side today.
Carried 25 Brls Labrador codfish to Trinity East this pm. These 25
Brls will go to St. John's by Schooner "Dorothy Beryl" for
shipment to Liverpool.

Tuesday, May 23

Fine day, cold. Wind Southerly.

Finished copper painting "Wilson" today.

Wednesday, May 24

Wind Southerly. Fine.

Getting "Wilson" painted around and bending sails etc, etc today.

This vessel was also surveyed this pm by Capts Rd Fowlow and A Lahey.

Thursday, May 25

Wind South West in morning, blowing strong.

"Wilson" ready for Lareburn but blowing too hard to 'beat up'.

Mr W.N. White left for Saint John's by this morning's train.

After dinner (4pm) wind N.N. East with a few heavy showers of rain.

Cooper painted one side of "Saffron" today.

Brought "Hunter" down from Tom Jones Cove this am.

Friday, May 26

A cold day. Wind North West with snow showers.

Finished copper painting "Saffron".

"Wilson" left for Loreburn at midnight (last night).

Saturday, May 27

Shifting winds. North in morning to South West in evening.

"Wilson" returned from Loreburn at 4pm with "Saffron's" and

"Hunter's" crews.

Cold after tea.

Sunday, May 28

Labrador codfish aboard for St. John's.

Calm with dense fog at 10pm.

Calm and foggy during evening and night.

Mr and Mrs W.N. White arrived from St. John's by this morning's train.

Saturday, June 10

Wind Easterly, very light.

"Wilson" sailed (towed out) at 9:30am for St. John's.

Very little wind until 4pm when there was a light breeze from North East.

"Wilson" returned at 10pm. Wind then South East with fog.

Sunday, June 11

Fine day. Wind North West, fair breeze.

"Wilson" left for St. John's at 6am.

Monday, June 12

Wind Southerly with thick fog after dinner.

"Saffron" arrived from St. John's at 8pm with a full load of salt and supplies.
