William Tibbs 80 years of age died this evening.

The Foresters who left here on January 23rd arrived in Scotland all well so radio said tonight.

Wednesday, February 7

Tuesday, February 13

Stormy, wind Northerly blowing strong.

M.V. "Isabel H" here from Catalina at 9:30am, took onboard 125

Brls codfish from our store and left for St. John's at 11 am.

A train left Clarendville yesterday at noon with a mail and at 11 o'clock this morning had only reached Princeton.

Wednesday, February 14

Wind North to North East. Snowing little all day.

Train arrived at Station at 4:30pm with . This mail left St. John's last Thursday 8th. This train did not proceed any further than the station here and left on the return trip to Clarendville about 7pm.

Thursday, February 15

Fine morning. No wind until noon when there was a light breeze from the Southward, sky became dull and overcast with every indication of snow.

The following subject was debated last night at the Churchmen's Club here - "Resolved that Government interference in business is unjust to the individual, and against the best interests of a Country's economic and social welfare". The leaders were Messrs S.J. Hefferton and W.N. White for the affirmation and negative respectively. The affirmative won by a small majority.

Friday, February 16

Wind North East, blowing strong all day with snow and drift until after dinner when it cleared off and got very cold.

Our train was somewhere between Catalina and Port Rexton at 5pm evidently finding the 'going ' very difficult.

Saturday, February 24

M.V. "Isabel H" by our wharf at 7:30 last night from Catalina took on board 50 Brls codfish and left for St. John's at 8:30. "Isabel H" did not have room enough for 100 Brls which we had ready to ship. Train passed up last night and at noon today was in the vicinity of Trinity Pond.

Sunday, February 25

A beautifully fine day.

Our train which had got as far as Trinity Pond, returned to the Station here last evening owing to engine becoming disabled.

This train must now await the arrival of an engine from Clarendville before proceeding any further.

Monday, February 26

Train which left Clarenville yesterday morning is now 6pm about 12 miles from here short of coal. An engine with coal left Clarenville at 3pm.
