Fine and cold. Wind North. Quite a bit of snow fell last night.

Monday, January 4

Fine, cold. Wind South West.

Frampton left early this morning for St. John's but returned after an hour or so.

Rupert, son of Mr & Mrs F.J. Morris who had been here on leave left by yesterday's train. Rupert is a member of the Royal Canadian Engineers and is stationed somewhere in Canada.

Tuesday, January 5

Wind Southerly with hail and snow in early morning veering to North West about noon and blowing a gale remainder of day.

Wednesday, January 6

Fine day. Wind West, good breeze. Cold.

Frampton left early this morning for St. John's.

Thursday, January 7

Wind South West blowing strong with occasional snow showers. Commenced packing Labrador fish this am (9 o'clock) and up to 'Knock off time" (6pm) had 130 Barrels packed.

Mr Collins who arrived here last evening is supervising the packing.

Friday, January 8

Cold. Wind South West with snow flurries.

S.S. "Glencoe" here at 7 o'clock last evening from St. John's and remained in port all night.

Packing fish all day. 274 Brls packed at 6pm.

Mr & Mrs W.N. White arrived from St. John's by this morning's train.

Saturday, January 9

Fine. Cold. Wind North, nice breeze.

Finished packing our Labrador fish at noon. Total now packed 321 Barrels.

Sunday, January 10

Wind North. Cold and raw.

Monday, January 11

Wind North, light

Schooner "AB Mills" here from St. John's at 6:30 last evening.

Tuesday, January 12

A beautifully fine day, very little wind.

Wednesday, January 13

In morning wind Southerly snowing and drifting until about 11 o'clock when wind veered South West and blew strong remainder of day.

Thursday, January 14
Fine day but a bit cold. Wind North light.

Friday, January 15
Calm. Cold and fine.

Saturday, January 16
Wind South shifting to North East light.
"Picking" snow all day.

Sunday, January 17
Wind North very light with snow flurries. Cold in afternoon and night.

Monday, January 18
Cold. Wind North nice breeze.

Tuesday, January 19
Wind North, good breeze. Cold.
Schooner "AB Mills" here at 1pm from Thoroughfare bound to St. John's.
S.S. "Glencoe" here at 11 o'clock last night bound to St. John's on her last trip for the season.
South West Arm froze over last night.

Wednesday, January 20
Wind this morning Southerly blowing strong shifting to North West about noon when it increased with high drift and turned out a very stormy day.

Thursday, January 21

A very cold day. Wind North West strong. Thermometer registered 8 degrees below zero this morning. At 5pm wind dropping but still very cold.

Schooner "AB Mills" still here awaiting time to St. John's.

Friday, January 22

Wind North to North East. Cold last night and today. Harbor froze over last night.

People walked on South West Arm yesterday first time for this season.

Saturday, January 23

A fine day. Wind North light cold.

Schooner "AB Mills" left here at 8:00am for St. John's but returned at 1:30pm.

Two men crossed the Harbor ice from Trinity East this am.

The British Army entered Tripoli North Africa this am.

Sunday, January 24

Dull wind. North light.

Monday, January 25

Fine day. Wind North. Fair breeze. Cold. Harbor frozen good and solid now. People crossing back and forth.
"AB Mills" still by Government wharf awaiting time.

Tuesday, January 26

Calm, dull with scattered snow flurries.

Train in from Clarendville this pm with a small foreign mail. Our last mail was on the 19th.

The train which is leaving St. John's this pm will make no connections with the Bonavista branch, this means we will get no mail until Friday 29th.

Wednesday, January 27

Fine day. Wind North, light.

Harbor ice is now solid and quite a few people were on it today.
Schooner "AB Mills" left for St. John's early this morning and has a nice time.

We were led to believe yesterday that train would be leaving St. John's on Thursday (tomorrow) but today's news says they will not leave until Friday. Consequently, we will get no mail until Saturday.

Thursday, January 28

Fine day. Cold. Wind North West.

Schooner "AB Mills" arrived at St. John's last evening.

Friday, January 29

A fine day. Wind North West. Very cold last night and today.

Last night the Branch of the Red Cross here, put off an entertainment in the shape of a card tournament, supper and dance for the purpose of raising funds. The affair was quite successful, proceeds amounted to approximately \$114.00.

Saturday, January 30

The funeral of the late Stella Morris, who lost her life when the Old Colony Club at St. John's was burnt to the ground a few days ago, took place here yesterday afternoon.

Fine day but cold. Wind North West.

Train due from Clarendville at 6pm with a mail. This will be our first mail since the 19th.

Sunday, January 31

A beautifully fine day. No wind.

A good many people here from trinity East availed of the fine day and took a walk on the Harbor which is now frozen almost to Admiral's Island.

Monday, February 1

A bit mild today. Wind South light.

Train which arrived Saturday night brought a large mail which was opened and distributed just before midnight. This is the first mail we had since January 19th.

Tuesday, February 2

Wind South East to South West. Snowing fast from 10am till 1pm when it cleared off.

The Trinity Benefit Club held its 105th Annual Meeting today.

Wednesday, February 3

Fine day. Wind West, light.

Thursday, February 4

Fine - light air of wind from a Westerly direction.

Horses hauling some of our Labrador codfish to station today for shipment to St. John's. The car to take this fish was put off at the station this morning by the regular train from Bonavista.

Friday, February 5

Wind Southerly blowing strong. Harbor ice breaking up. Snowing for a time after dinner.

Finished hauling 160 Brls fish to station this am and stowed aboard car. We have 40 Brls more to ship which we will probably send in tomorrow.

Saturday, February 6

A beautifully fine day, very little wind.

Car with our 160 Brls Labrador Codfish was taken to Clarenville this morning.

Hauled a further 40 Brls Labrador codfish to station today. These 40 Brls will go by Monday morning's train.

Sunday, February 7

Mild, snowing in forenoon and raining in afternoon and night.

Monday, February 8
Mild with rain in evening.

Tuesday, February 9
Mild. Wet showers in forenoon and some light rain after dinner.

Wednesday, February 10
Wind North East increasing as day advanced and from noon it was blowing strong with snow and high drift.

Thursday, February 11

Fine in morning but dull in afternoon. Wind Southerly blowing fairly strong at 6pm.

Friday, February 12

Wind Southerly blowing a gale from early morning until after dinner when it dropped a bit. There was some rain during the day.

Saturday, February 13

A fine day. Wind West, nice breeze.

Sunday, February 14

Wind Southerly, blowing strong with hail snow and then rain.

M.V. "Swile" entered port at 2:30pm bound to St. John's.

Monday, February 15

Wind South, blowing a nice breeze after dinner with snow.

Tuesday, February 16

Wind N.N. West. Strong. Cold.

"Swile" sailed between midnight and daylight for St. John's.

Wednesday, February 17

Cold. Wind N.N. East. Commenced snowing about 1pm and continued remainder of day. It was very stormy at 6pm snowing fast and drifting furiously.

Thursday, February 18

A fine day but cold. Wind North. Piles of snow around after the blizzard which raged yesterday and last night.

Wind North West. Fair breeze. It was cold last night and is so today. Harbor is now frozen over again.

Fine. Wind North light. People crossing Harbor ice today.

Sunday, February 21

Mild. Raining in evening.

Monday, February 22
Wind North shifting to South in afternoon.

Tuesday, February 23
A beautifully fine day with shifting winds. Nice and warm especially in afternoon.

Wednesday, February 24
Fine. Wind Southwest.

Thursday, February 25
Mild, Wind South light.

Friday, February 26
Fine day but cold. Wind North, blowing strong.

Saturday, February 27
Snowing fast all day with some drift. Wind Southerly, fair breeze.

Sunday, February 28
A beautifully fine day. Wind West, light.

Roads are covered with ice making walking very dangerous.

Tuesday, March 9

Fine day. Cold. Wind North West.

People crossing Harbor ice today.

Wednesday, March 10

Fine day but cold. Wind West, light.

Following stores closed today; Morris, Batson and Ryan Brothers Ltd.

Eriksens were open and possibly Goldsworthy.

Thursday, March 11
Fine. Wind Southerly, blowing strong.

Friday, March 12
Mild day - raining after dinner.

Saturday, March 13
Raining early morning and forenoon with wind Southerly. In afternoon and nice and warm. Wind Easterly, light.

Sunday, March 14

Monday, March 15

A formation of 11 planes passed over here at 3pm bound Northward and after an hour returned again going off in a Southerly direction.

The stores of F.J. Morris and this firm were closed all day - Eriksen and Batson closed after dinner.

Messrs F.J. Morris and P. McGrath went to King's Cove this morning and returned at 11pm.

Mild. Fine. Wind Southerly.

Friday, March 19
Fine day. Wind North West, cold.
Miss R. Fowlow Telegraph Operator here, whilst going to her
office this morning fell on the ice and gave her ankle a bad
fracture.

Saturday, March 20
A very fine day but cold. Wind North West.

Sunday, March 21
Wind Northerly, a bit cold with scattered snow flurries.

Monday, March 22

Wind North. Fine.

Const Baggs went to St. John's by this morning's train with a patient for the Mental Asylum.

Tuesday, March 23

Mild. Wind Southerly very light.

Wednesday, March 24

Wind East North East blowing strong after dinner with snow showers.

Thursday, March 25

A very fine day. Wind North shifting to South in evening.

Friday, March 26

Wind Northerly, mild. About two inches of snow fell before daylight this morning.

Saturday, March 27

Fine day. Wind South West blowing strong after dinner.

Sunday, March 28

Calm with wet snow falling all day.

Monday, March 29

Fine, cold. Wind Northerly fair breeze.

Three to four inches of snow fell early this morning.

Commenced repairing cod traps this morning.

Tuesday, March 30

Winter weather prevailing all day.

Const Baggs returned from St John's by this morning's train.

Too rough for our three shop girls to venture out.

Mr W.N. White left his home to come to office but after getting down about fifty yards decided to turn back as it was drifting fast and furious then and stay home for remainder of day.

Thursday, April 1

Decreasing North East Wind a bit mild.

Sometime last night or early this morning some large pans of ice which drifted down from the arm collided with our long wharf causing it to collapse in the centre. On the wharf were about 1600 sticks firewood which we saw this morning floating around between the wharf and in the dock. Some of it drifted around the Nuddick and more went through the Narrows.

Friday, April 2

Wind Southerly. Fair breeze, mild.

Had men employed last evening moving about 300 sacks flour, from flour store to our #3 store. Pans of ice did considerable damage to the posts under flour store so it was though advisable to move flour fearing a breakdown.

So far we have recovered about 3/400 sticks firewood which were on wharf when it collapsed.

Saturday, April 3

Wind Southerly, light foggy. Raining after dinner.

Sunday, April 4

Calm and foggy with some light showers during day.

Monday, April 5
Wind North East, light, mild.

Tuesday, April 6
Wind Easterly light. Fine in afternoon.

It rained hard between midnight (last night) and daylight. Very warm and sultry wind North at 4pm.

Thursday, June 24

Wind N.N. West blowing strong.

Agreed with Sam Miller for following wages - minimum wages to be \$200.00 with a bonus of \$50... - anytime over 4 months to be at \$50 per month.

Friday, June 25

Wind Southerly light with scattered showers.

S.S. "Glencoe" here from North at 9 oclock last night and remained in port until daylight.

S.S. "Kyle" here at 2;30 this morning bound to Labrador.

Bishop O'Neill was a passenger by "Kyle" and landed here.

Schooner "AB Mills" left early this morning for St. John's.

Saturday, June 26

Fine day. Wind North N. West strong breeze for a while.

Bishop O'Neill left here this forenoon for Catalina.

Sunday, June 27

Wind Southerly light with scatted showers.

Monday, June 28

Wind Southerly, good breeze with rain in evening.

Schooner "Mary Pauline" with a cargo of coal arrived here at 4:30pm from North Sydney via Port Union. It was blowing too strong then to moor vessel by coal wharf but after tea Capt. Hardy got vessel alongside and made ready for discharging in morning.

Tuesday, June 29

Fine day little or no wind before dinner.

In afternoon, wind North blowing strong.

"Mary Pauline" commenced discharging at 6:30am.

A seaplane landed here this afternoon having flown to Champney's with a sick man from the Gander airport - after a short delay the plane left again.
