Morel-Nemish

In 1982, Dominique Morel and Douglas Nemish graduated with Master Degrees in performance from the Faculty of Music of l'Universite de Montreal, where they studied with Alissa Mitchenko and Jean-Eudes Vaillancourt. Recipients of grants from both the Quebec Government and the Canada Arts Council, they pursued three years of post-graduate studies at the Franz Liszt Academy in Budapest under the guidance of Ferenc Rados and Gyorgy Kurtag. During this period, Morel and Nemish returned to Canada on numerous occasions for concert tours, television and radio recordings as well as concert engagements with orchestra.

In July, 1985, they made their debut appearance with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Andrew Davis, followed by two East European debuts: one in Budapest at the gala concert in Vigado Hall, inaugurating the International Year of Youth and the other in Sofia, Bulgaria, at the gala concert of the 23rd. UNESCO conference. Just back from Salzburg, Austria, after intensive studies with Alfons Kontarsky, the duo recently (Nov. '87) performed with l'Orchestre des Jeunes du Quebec under the direction of Michel Tabachnik. In March, '88, Dominique Morel and Douglas Nemish will be making their debut with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra performing the world premiere of a newly commissioned work by the Canadian composer Violet Archer.
