## MARY ANN CRAIG

Dr. Mary Ann Craig has a Doctor of Music Education degree and the distinction of being awarded the first Performer's Certificate on the euphonium from Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana. She is currently Associate Professor of Music at The College of Saint Rose, Albany, New York and State Chair for Research for the New York State School Music Association. She is President of the Society for Music Teacher Education - Eastern Division and frequently presents clinics at national, divisional, and state conferences.

As a euphonium performer and teacher, Dr. Craig has appeared as soloist and low brass clinician throughout the United States, Japan, and Australia. Most recently she was euphonium soloist at the International Tuba-Euphonium Conference in Japan, where she also performed with the Colonial Tuba Quartet. She is a faculty member of the Keystone Brass Institute of the Summit Brass in Colorado during the summer. Dr. Craig has appeared in tuba-euphonium ensembles with Harvey Phillips in Carnegie Hall and as soloist at the Mozart Festival in Vermont. She has recorded a solo euphonium album, which was released in 1988.

Dr. Craig's previous teaching experience includes public school teaching in Seneca Valley School District, Harmony, Pennsylvania and college teaching at Goulburn College and Wollongong Conservatorium in Australia. At the College of Saint Rose Dr. Craig directs the Wind Ensemble and teaches applied low brass, graduate and undergraduate music education courses. She is frequently invited to be guest conductor and adjudicator of solo and band festivals. Performing on a Willson euphonium, Dr. Craig is a clinician for DEG Music Products Inc.

## KRISTINA SZUTOR

Pianist Kristina Szutor is a native of British Columbia who has been recently transplanted to Newfoundland where she has taken a position as Assistant Professor at Memorial University. She holds a Master's degree from the Juilliard School and is presently completing a Doctoral degree from the University of British Columbia. She has performed with orchestras such as the Quebec Symphony and the Vancouver Philharmonic and she can be heard frequently on CBC radio both locally and nationally. She is a member of the contemporary music ensemble known as the Blue Rider which recently returned from a successful performance at an international Schoenberg conference in Barcelona.
