A graduate from the UBC School of Music and Indiana University, **Julia Nolan** was appointed an instructor at UBC in 1988, at Western Washington University (Bellingham) in 1989 and at Douglas College in 1991. She has been a featured soloist for CBC and has performed with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Vancouver Opera and Pacific Symphonic Wind Ensemble, as well as with Saxoduo. Ms. Nolan will be featured on an upcoming CD recording with the CBC Vancouver Orchestra, which will be released in April or May 1994. She recently returned from a sojourn at the Paris Conservatory on a Canada Council grant. The CBC has commissioned Vancouver composer Fred Stride to write a concerto for Julia Nolan which will be premièred in the spring of 1994. Ms. Nolan is a clinician for Yamaha Canada Limited and gratefully acknowledges their assistance.

Pianist **Kristina Szutor** is a native of British Columbia who is enjoying her third year in Newfoundland where she is Assistant Professor at Memorial University. She holds a master's degree from the Juilliard School and she will be completing her doctoral degree from the University of British Columbia in the coming year. She has performed as both soloist and chamber musician throughout Canada and recently in Barcelona, Spain as well, at an international festival of Arnold Schoenberg's music. She was a finalist in the CBC National Competition and her performances are frequently aired on CBC radio both locally and nationally. Kristina is an avid squash player, an outdoors enthusiast and a vegetarian cook.
