Nancy Dahn, violin, studied at the New England Conservatory, The Juilliard School, and the Cleveland Institute of Music, where she completed her doctorate in violin performance. She was awarded fellowships to study and perform at the Tanglewood Music Centre for three summers, and has also performed at the Banff Centre for the Arts, the Taos School of Music, and the Britten-Pears Festival in Aldeburgh, England. A finalist in the 1994 Louise McMahon International Competitions, Dr. Dahn has performed as a recitalist and soloist with orchestra in Canada, the United States, England, France and Switzerland. Prior to joining the faculty at Memorial, she taught violin and chamber music at the Cleveland Institute of Music as the assistant to Donald Weilerstein.

Paul Bendzsa, clarinet and saxophone, studied at the University of Western Ontario, Ohio University and the University of Iowa. His enthusiasm for new music and musical adventure has led him to founding memberships in a diverse number of ensembles: the Atlantic Arts Trio, the Canadian Saxophone Quartet, Fusion, the Blue Ryder Ensemble and most recently the Borealis Ensemble. These collaborations have taken him on tours across Canada, and to England, Spain, Hong Kong, Korea and Australia.

Catherine Fitch, soprano, received her Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education degrees at Mount Allison University, and completed the Master of Music degree at the University of British Columbia. Her singing engagements have included solo recitals in London and appearances at the Britten-Pears School for Advanced Musical Studies, Le Centre d'Arts d'Orford, The Banff Festival, and with the Vancouver Cantata Singers. Catherine Fitch gave the premiere of Michael R. Miller's "Tread the Waters" commissioned on the occasion of the International Year of Canadian Music at St. James Church, Piccadilly and studied with Madame Vera Rozsa in London, England.

Carolyn Hart, soprano, received her Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees from the University of Toronto, and her doctorate from the University of British Columbia. Further studies took her to the Banff School of Fine Arts, the Britten-Pears School in Aldeburgh, England, and the Academie de Musique in Lausanne, Switzerland. A finalist in the CBC national competition and the Eckhardt-Grammatté competition, she is an active recitalist and highly regarded proponent of new music. She has toured extensively in Canada, Asia and Great Britain, and is heard frequently on CBC Radio broadcasts.

Maureen Volk, piano, completed her undergraduate studies at the University of Regina. A recipient of several grants from the Canada Council, she completed her Master of Music degree at The Juilliard School and her doctorate in piano at Indiana University. Her principal teachers have been Sasha Gorodnitzki, Shigeo Neriki, and Edna Golandsky. A prize winner in numerous competitions, including the William S. Boyd Piano Competition, Dr. Volk has performed as a recitalist, orchestral soloist and chamber musician in Canada and the United States.
