Nancy Dahn received her training at the New England Conservatory, the Juilliard School, and the Cleveland Institute of Music, where she completed a doctorate in violin performance. She performs as soloist and chamber musician but is most active as one half of *Duo Concertante* which performs frequently throughout Canada and the United States. Their debut CD, *à deux*, on ATMA Records has been met with favorable reviews and is frequently heard on CBC. Dr. Dahn is a professor at Memorial University's School of Music, where she teaches violin and conducts the award winning MUN Chamber Orchestra.

Theo Weber is the principal cellist of the Newfoundland Symphony Orchestra as well as being the cellist for the Atlantic String Quartet. He earned a bachelor of music degree from the University of Michigan and a master of music degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music. His past teachers have included Samuel Mayes (principal cellist of the Philadelphia and Boston Symphony Orchestras), Jeffrey Solow and Alan Harris. Aside from his love of music, Theo enjoys woodworking, flying and spending time with his family which now includes a baby girl, Nina, who is seven months old.

Maureen Volk began her piano studies in Saskatchewan, and received her bachelor of music degree from the University of Regina. With the assistance of The Canada Council, she continued her studies at The Juilliard School in New York, where she received her master of music degree, and at Indiana University, where she completed her doctorate in 1992. Her principal teachers have been Sasha Gorodnitzki, Shigeo Neriki, and most recently, Edna Golandsky. Dr. Volk has performed as a recitalist, orchestral soloist and chamber musician in Canada and the United States. She was president of the Canadian University Music Society from 1997-99, and she has been director of the School of Music at Memorial since 1990.
