Pianist Timothy Steeves performs regularly throughout North America as a chamber musician, recitalist and concerto soloist. He has appeared with many of Canada's orchestras, including the Kingston Symphony, Saskatoon Symphony, Niagara Symphony, PEI Symphony and Nova Sinfonia. More frequently heard as one-half of Duo Concertante, with his wife, violinist Nancy Dahn, he has performed recently in Los Angeles (Los Angeles County Museum of Art), San Francisco (Old First Concerts), Toronto (University of Toronto), Montreal (Chapelle du Bon Pasteur), Chicago (Dame Myra Hess series), Ottawa (National Arts Centre and Ottawa International Chamber Music Festival) and New York City (Trinity Church). Tonight's program will be presented again next week in a four venue tour of Florida.

Timothy Steeves has released two commercial recordings for the Montreal-based ATMA Classique label: *À deux* (music of Ravel, Beethoven, Brahms and Stravinsky) and *Of Heart and Homeland* (music of Janacek, Dvorak, de Falla, Parker and Smetana) both of which were nominated for Best Classical Recording at the East Coast Music Awards and which received a five-star recommendation from *La Scena Musicale*. His third disc, *Wild Honey* (ATMA Classique), features works written especially for the Duo by Chan Ka Nin, Omar Daniel, Kelly-Marie Murphy, Andrew P. MacDonald and Jean Lesage and will be available March 2004.

Mr. Steeves is often heard on national programs of the CBC, SRC, RCI, and NPR in the United States. With Duo Concertante, he has appeared on the "On Stage" segment of TVO's *Studio 2* and on February 14th will be featured on *Bravo!* television's *The Classical Now* series. The same day, Radio Canada International will be presenting another half-hour feature on the Duo.

Timothy Steeves is currently associate professor of piano at Memorial University. In 2003, he was awarded the President's Award for Outstanding Research for his performing and commissioning activities with Nancy Dahn. He also serves as artistic director of the Tuckamore Festival, a two week chamber music festival in August for talented young string players and pianists. He lives in St. John's with Nancy and their two children, Clara and Sasha.
