## Memorial University's Festival of Anniversaries

will celebrate several key events during 1998-2000

- 75th anniversary of the founding of Memorial University College (1925),
- 50th anniversary of the establishment of Memorial University of Newfoundland as a degree-granting institution (1949),
- 35th anniversary of the creation of the Marine Institute (1964) and
- 25th anniversary of the opening of Sir Wilfred Grenfell College in Corner Brook (1975).

The central image in the **Celebrate Memorial logo** is the **Memorial Tower**, being built on the St. John's campus through the generous support of the Johnson Family Foundation. **The clock** symbolizes exciting time spent at the university by Memorial's students, past, present and future. **The flame**, in conjunction with the tower, represents a birthday candle in celebration of our anniversaries. The flame also commemorates those brave souls who, in war, gave their lives for freedom and for whom the university will always be a memorial. The central image is also **a stylized ship**, representing the university's marine orientation and a critical part of her academic mission. In the **colour spectrum** behind the tower, the orange and yellow represent the sun setting on Memorial's illustrious past and the sun rising on her emerging future. The green and blue represent Newfoundland's natural environment — the land, the sky and the ocean — that serves to shape Memorial University forever.
